Our policy is that we do go outside for recess as long as the temperatures is above zero degrees and it is not raining or snowing heavily.

CONVERSATION STARTERS

Empathy is the theme for our guidance classes for December. One way to think about empathy is "the ability to sense other people's emotions, coupled with the ability to imagine what someone else might be thinking or feeling."

Empathy is an important skill for creating connected and kind communities. It is critical for relationships.

Some questions to pose could be:

- How can you understand someone else's point of view during an argument?
- How do you feel when you realize why someone might have misunderstood what you said?
- How do you feel when you realize something you said was a mistake?

Perseverance will be our theme in guidance classes for December. One way to think about perseverance is "the ability to work through situations even when there are obstacles or challenges in the way."

Some questions to pose could be:

- What's a challenge for you now?
- What's the hardest part?
- What are some resources (people, strategies, or tools) that can help you?
- What is one step we can take together to overcome this challenge?
