# FOOD SERVICE COSTS

All students will once again have access to a free breakfast this school year since Wonewoc-Center qualifies for a federal program that supplies breakfast for free. While breakfast will be served at no cost, the federal waiver for a free lunch has expired. Therefore, the regular price for elementary students is \$2.80. There is still the possibility for free or reduced cost lunch for qualifying families. To determine eligibility, the family must complete a Free and Reduced Meal Application. If you have money left in your student lunch account from the end of last school year, it has remained in the account for the start of the school year.

Breakfast and lunch menus can be found by clicking on the paper bag icon at the top of the district website. I will also be sure that a paper copy comes home as well.



### **FOOD SHARE TABLE**

Sharing Tables are provided to reduce the amount of wasted food at schools. Children can place approved unconsumed food or beverage items they choose not to eat on the Food Share Table. Any student may share unopened, packaged food, milk, or fruit on the table to share with others. Other children have the opportunity to take these items at no extra cost.

## **ICE CREAM NOVELTIES**

In keeping with tradition, students in grades 3-5 can purchase ice cream novelties for \$1 during lunch on Fridays.

### **I-READY**

This year Wonewoc-Center Elementary will be using a program called i-Ready. i-Ready is an online program for reading and/or mathematics that will help your student's teacher(s) determine your student's needs, personalize their learning, and monitor progress throughout the school year. i-Ready allows your teacher(s) to meet your student exactly where they are and provides data to increase your student's learning gains. i-Ready consists of two parts: Diagnostic and Personalized Instruction.

The i-Ready Diagnostic is an adaptive assessment that adjusts its questions to suit your student's needs. Each item a student sees is individualized based on their answer to the previous question. For example, a series of correct answers will result in slightly harder questions, while a series of incorrect answers will yield slightly easier questions. The purpose of this is not to give your student a score or grade, but instead to determine how best to support your student's learning.

i-Ready Personalized Instruction provides students with lessons based on their individual skill level and needs, so your student can learn at a pace that is just right for them. These lessons are fun and interactive to keep your student engaged as they learn.
