## Academic and Career Four-Year Plan



Students should verify entrance requirements with the school they are interested in attending. After a college application is sent, it is the student's responsibility to notify them of any schedule changes, as it may influence an acceptance, denial, or wait-list decision.

## Academic and Career Four-Year Plan: Notes

| Department | Required Credits | Four-Year Planning Notes |

| English | 4.0 | * Students are required to take four credits of English including English 9, English 10, English 11, and English 12 or AP English Literature and Composition. |
| Math | 3.0 | * Three years of sequential math are required for admission into four-year colleges. <br> * Algebra 1A and Algebra 1 B combined will only be considered as one year of math by post-secondary institutions, however, will be considered as two years for Wonewoc-Center graduation requirements. <br> * College-bound students are strongly encouraged to take a fourth year of math. |
| Science | 3.0 | * Three years of lab sciences are required for admission into four-year colleges. <br> * College-bound students looking at careers in science-related fields should strongly consider a fourth year of a lab science. <br> * Students considering going in to a Health Science career are required to take Chemistry to get into their program - even for the technical college programs! <br> * Agricultural Biotechnology, Animal Production/Science, and General Horticulture (Agriculture, Food \& Natural Resources Department) are considered acceptable lab science courses by four-year colleges. |
| Social Studies | 3.0 | * College-bound students are strongly encouraged to take a fourth year of social studies. |
| Academic and Career | 1.0 | * College \& Career Readiness is a half-credit graduation requirement for all students. <br> * Financial Literacy is a half-credit graduation requirement for all students. |
| Health | 0.5 | * Required; typically taken as a freshman opposite of PE 9. |
| Physical Education | 1.5 | * While you earn 0.5 credits of PE in your freshman year, students must take at least two more semesters of PE in either their sophomore, junior, or senior year. <br> * Students often forget about this requirement until the end and it becomes difficult to schedule it among AP and music classes your senior year! <br> * Athletes who successfully complete a full season of a sport during their Junior or Senior year may receive 0.5 credit in place of taking PE during that year. |
| Language | - | Consideration of two years of the same language should be given to meet the entrance or global perspectives requirements for some colleges (UW: Madison, Milwaukee, Parkside, and Platteville; Private: Alverno, Beloit, Carroll, Concordia, Edgewood, Lakeland, Lawrence, Marian, Marquette, MIAD, Mount Mary, Northland, Ripon, St. Norbert, Silver Lake, and WI Lutheran). |
| Senior <br> Portfolio \& Exit <br> Interview | 1.0 | * Students will have to compile a Senior Portfolio according to a rubric and sit before a panel of community members to answer questions. This is a Pass/Fail grade. |
| Community Service | 30 hours | * All students must complete a minimum of 30 hours of community service during their high school years. |
