WONEWOC-CENTER BASE PROGRAM

The BASE (Before/After School Education) Program at Wonewoc-Center Elementary/Middle School has off to a great start. The program is now providing intervention/enrichment and homework help to approximately 80 K-8 students Monday through Thursday after school and Tuesday through Friday mornings.

Students begin each afternoon with a healthy snack, short recess, and then it is on to reading/math time. Students work with certified staff to improve

their skills in areas of math and reading for ½ hour.

Students again work with staff for the next half hour on homework. In this time we hope students will ask questions of the staff members to help them understand what needs to be done.



Many students complete their homework, but some students may have homework to complete when they get home. If students are continuing to come home with a large amount of homework to do please contact the school and let Dr. Sharon Ennis



know of your concern. The last 45 minutes students have been involved in a number of enrichment activities. These activities may be academic, physical activities, speakers, or field trips. In this first 6 weeks, students have had guest



INFLUENZA VS. COLD SYMPTOMS

Symptoms	Cold	Flu
Fever	Rare	High (100-102 degrees), lasting 3-4 days
Headache	Rare	Common
General Aches and Pains	Slight	Usual, often severe
Fatigue, Weakness	Mild	May last for 3 weeks
Extreme Exhaustion	Never	Common, Starts early in sickness
Stuffy Nose	Common	Sometimes
Sneezing	Common	Sometimes
Sore Throat	Common	Sometimes
Chest Discomfort/Cough	Mild	Common, may be severe
Complications	Sinus Congestion or Earache	Bronchitis, Pneumonia, may be life-threatening
Prevention	Good Hygiene	Good Hygiene, Annual Flu shot or FluMist
Treatment	Temporary symptom relief	Antiviral drugs within 24-48 hours of symptom onset
